She was very much the young artist but over the many decades became a focused and purposeful social and environmental activist. Very impressed with the work that she and her fellow advocates are doing, I wondered about how my past professional work and my current avocation affected change for the better.

My husband had a favorite mud colored T- shirt that proclaimed in thin white scrawl...." I draw pictures all day for a living". Whenever he wore it, people would stop him to ask what exactly does he *really* do. 

My 8-year-old granddaughter Azalea really is my best buddy for attending art shows or galleries. Recently we visited the ROSHAMBO show at the **Graton Gallery**. "ROSHAMBO," another name for the Rock-Paper-Scissors game, features work made from or depicting rocks, paper, and/or scissors. She could identify the various mediums as she looked at a piece, and of course liked the animal ones the

most. Almost as much as the gingerbread cake with whipped cream at Willow Wood afterwards ;-)

In the show are works by several AWS artists, including **Diane Ceccarelli, Linda Donahue, Patricia Marina, Gail Mardfin, Leah Ocean, Dana Rodney**, and **Kim Winte**r. It's always fun to see AWS names on the wall, and even better when a piece can be identified from afar because of its signature style, as with Kim Winter's. Zaylie recognized it even before *I* got to it!



APRIL WATERCOLOR DEMO WITH JEAN WARREN, NWS, CWS by Beverly Bird

Watercolorist Jean Warren presented a comprehensive and informative demo, sharing her inspirations, techniques and insights, while creating a beautiful watercolor. Viewers learned first-hand about her approach and details about creating her masterful works, a number of which she brought to show, including watercolor sketchbooks of paintings done *en plein air*, paintings in progress, and completed pieces.

In creating her demo painting, Jean worked on a dry, cold-press half-sheet of 140 lb. paper on which she had lightly sketched (HB pencil) a natural setting suggesting stream, rocks, and vegetation. ("The pencil sketch is the skeleton of the painting.")

She laid in broad strokes with a large brush in blues (manganese) and yellow – strokes she referred to as "rhythm washes," not paying too much attention to the drawing. She noted that it's important to get the feeling right away of



"the story you want to tell the viewer." She defined shapes by painting the negative spaces, working around shapes and darkening areas to bring out shapes. To lighten areas, she "lifts out," never using masking fluid; to remove paint, she sometimes uses acetate. She uses stamps she makes herself to add interest. She sometimes paints based on a triad of colors; for the demo piece she was focusing on manganese as the "Mother Color," adding in yellow and maroon, which lend to unifying the piece.



Jean's "go with the flow" approach produces works that often have a flowing abstract quality – she has learned to embrace the blooms and "oozles." Jean advised, "Let the painting tell you what to do next." She sometimes adds ink details and gouache to pieces. For ink drawing, she prefers a Pilot Precise V-7 pen - it will blend with water but in five minutes become permanent. She uses all different brands of watercolor. For finishing, she frames them with plexi or sometimes waxes her paintings. She also showed a piece that was wrapped on a stretched canvas, which also included collaged parts from pieces of old paintings.

Words of wisdom from Jean's many years of

experience: "Don't say it all." Sharing what a judge once told her – he looked for the works where it looked like the artist had found something for the first time.

Jean teaches and exhibits widely, including internationally. She is a signature member of the National Watercolor Society, California Watercolor, and a board member of the Society of Layerists in Multimedia.




